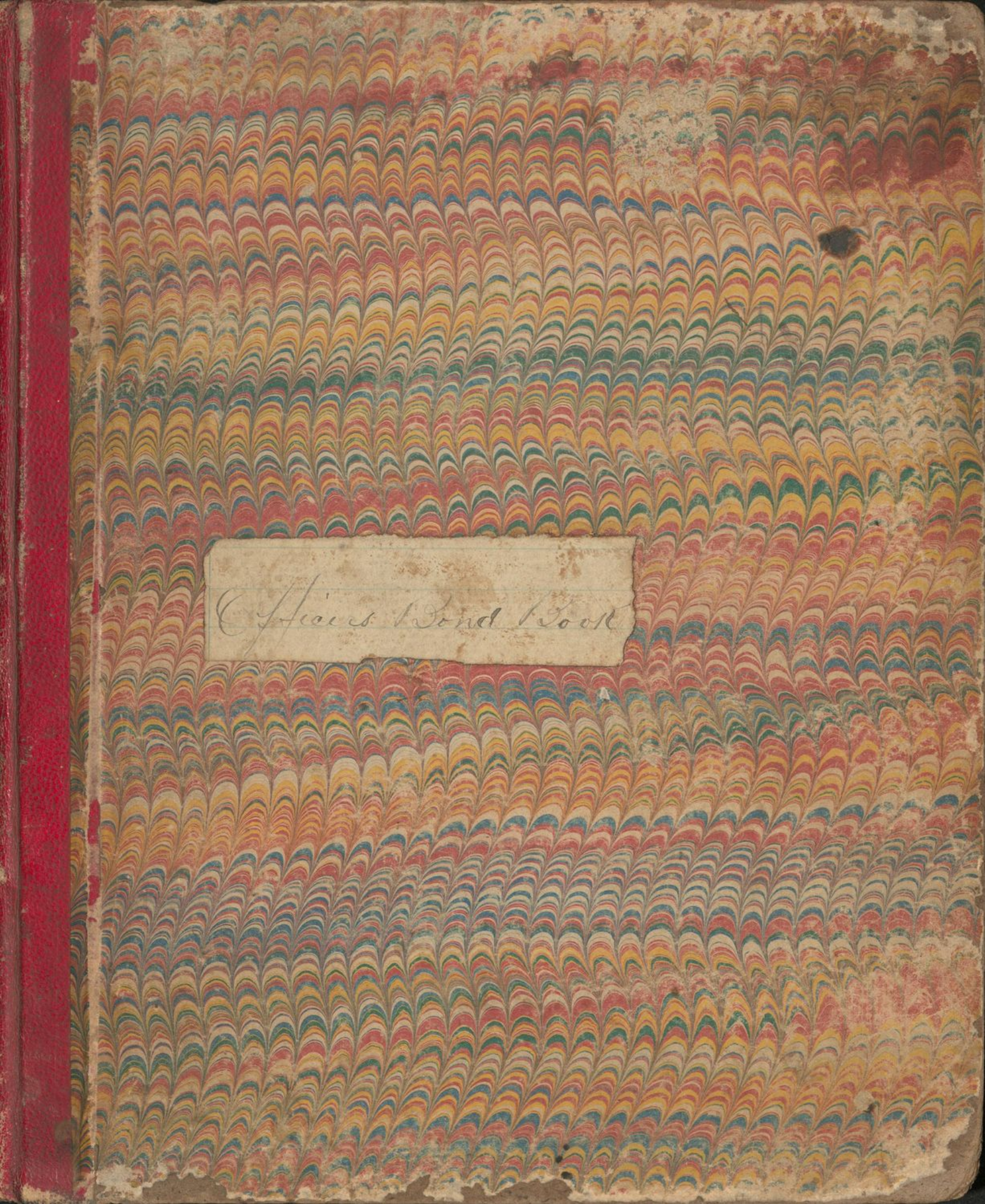

Alma has been very sick with a bad cold. She is up about the house though she lacks much of being well. The children all have a bad cold. In fact it is a general time for cold. I hope you are rid of your cold. Thomas K. Andrews has sold out for \$100. per acre. Albert Soominis has determined to buy hereabouts. He offered \$60.00 per acre for the slimer farm, it contains 150. Acres it is offered him for \$62½ which is the cheapest the Bryant farm or slimer. This is well located it lies 2 miles from depot. The orchard does not amount to a row of pines, fences are poor, water scarce. The old Bought farm is in the market at \$80. Land here is no weaker in price than last year. Alma says tell Mariah to come out when she can. Give my respects to the boys & their wives. Write soon as you can. If Soominis says any thing tell me. I wish I had tried that trade a little harder. I would like to have changed the kind of soil.

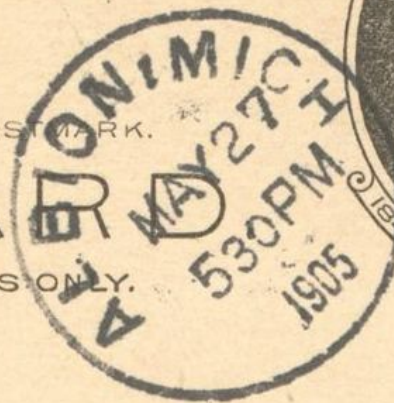

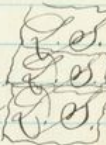
